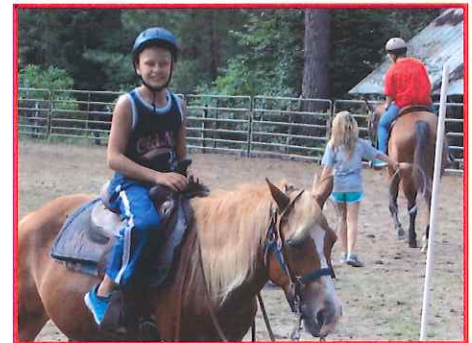
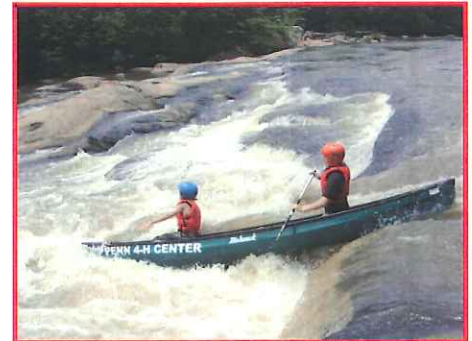




4-H Summer Camps

Who Can Attend? Boys and girls ages 8-14 may attend junior 4-H Camp. 4-H membership is NOT required.

How Much Does It Cost? The cost for Junior 4-H Camp is \$435. This includes all program fees, meals, transportation to and from Newton, and insurance. A **\$200 non-refundable deposit is due at the time of registration with the remaining balance due May 1.**

Teen Campers – Campers **age 13-14 years of age** participate in an outdoor adventure tract for older campers. Adventurer campers spend the night tent camping on property and focus on outdoor living skills. Trekkers leave the camp for a 2-day overnight camp-out that includes a full day canoe, rock climbing experience. Very limited spaces are available for 13-14 year old campers. There is an additional \$20 fee for Trekkers.

Information for Parents: Betsy-Jeff Penn 4-H Center is accredited by the American Camping Association located in Reidsville, NC. The seal of accreditation recognizes the camp has met certain standards in the areas of administration, program, personnel, and campsite.
