Plant Descriptions

Strawberries:

Chandler – Large berry with conical shape, very sweet and a good yield. Southern favorite.

Jewel – #1 midseason variety, recommended for commercial growers and home gardeners. Large berries with superb quality and flavor. Performs well over a wide range of growing conditions. Consistent performance. Plants have moderate winter hardiness.

Blueberries:

Climax - An early producer! Savor loads of large, sweet, early ripening blueberries. Great on cereals or baked into muffins, these southern blueberries are gaining in popularity! These pest-free shrubs reach 6 to 10 feet. Foliage turns fiery red in autumn.

Tifblue - The most universally outstanding rabbiteye blueberry grown to date. The fruits are large, light blue and ripen late in the season. The bush is vigorous and very productive. More cold hardy than most rabbiteye blueberries varieties.

Powder Blue - Medium to large size fruit, darker blue in color; sweet taste. Upright highly productive plant; good foliage. Blooms late in season.

Blackberries:

Arapaho – Thorn-less, earliest producing berry, ripening in mid-June. Requires no trellis, grows into a bush. Sweet berries with small seeds. New canes shoot up from roots to increase productivity.

Apache – Largest thorn-less, upright berry available. Sweet, cone shaped berry. Ripens late season. Cold hardy and high yielding.

Raspberries:

Heritage – Known for producing large crops of very large and sweet berries that are dark red in color. Good for freezing as well as making jellies and jams. Ripen in summer and fall.

Asparagus:

Jersey Giant – Known for its heavy yields, thick spears and outstanding flavor. Attractive dark green spears with purple bracts are large. Uniform and succulent. One of the most frost hardy varieties.
